BIMUN DRESS CODE

This document contains the dress code that every participant should obey during the Fundación Colegio Bilingüe de Valledupar Model of the United Nations, BIMUN. It should be clarified that the Dress Code seeks to guide both delegates, sponsors, observers and others present, in their personal appearance by mentioning appropriate and inappropriate clothing in this educational environment, as well as offering practical suggestions to project a diplomatic image that generates confidence, professionalism and maturity.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- > The clothing must be ironed and clean.
- > Make sure that the clothing combination is suitable for the event.
- > Keep your hairstyle professional. Avoid using garish accessories.
- > We recommend the use of neutral, dark colors, pastel and whites since these colors give you more seriousness. Please avoid using printed clothing or strong colors such as red, orange, yellow, etc. If you choose to use strong colors, please be discreet.
- > The use of caps, *bermudas*, t-shirts, sleeveless blouses, short pants, or similar attire such as leggings, jeans or other informal pants, or any types of sports clothing, is not permitted. Shoes should be professional, tennis or flip-flops are not allowed.
- It is prohibited to remove your coat during the sessions. Including Speaker's List, Moderated and Unmoderated Caucuses. This can be reviewed with a Motion to Relax the Dress Code.

SANCTIONS

The breach of the Dress Code will have sanctions. The first time a warning will be issued, and the delegate will be informed of the flaws; the second time, depending on the severity, the person could receive a second warning or be asked to leave the event until everything is in order and in line with the stipulations.

BONFIRE PARTY

BIMUN invites its delegates, sponsors and every assistant to the Bonfire Party that will begin in the evening of the third day. It is important to highlight that it is an informal event, and it has a different dress code. Guests should wear comfortable white clothing for this event. (Note: for FCBV delegates, they must be Eight Grade or above)

WOMEN

MEN

Upper part: shirt, blouse or dress.	The use of transparencies, pronounced cleavage, absence of sleeves, braces, or have one's back or abdomen uncovered, is forbidden In case of doubts, the use of blazers is recommended	Shirts must have buttons and long sleeves The use of a tie or bowtie is suggested
Lower part: pants or skirt	Skirts or dresses must be three fingers above the knee The use of any torn piece of clothes, is not allowed	It is suggested that jacket's and pant's colors match It is important to use a belt, and even better if its color is the same as the shoes
Footwear	If you choose to wear heels, make sure you feel comfortable with them The use of sandals, sports shoes or similar is forbidden	Footwear can be used in a modern cut with different shapes: low heel, moccasins or with rubber-soled shoes that are not for sport or informal Colors can vary, but it is preferred for shoes to be black or brown Socks must cover completely the feet and must go until half of the lower leg, and they must match with the suit
Others	Avoid overdone makeup Try subtle and not excessive accessories
